Neurofeedback to improve motor control after spinal cord injury

We are looking for people who had an incomplete spinal cord injury more than one year ago and, at the present time, are showing spasticity in the arms and/or legs.

You are invited to take part in a research study to test a rehabilitation therapy to reduce spasticity in people who have suffered an incomplete spinal cord injury. In this study, we will record your brain activity using electroencephalography (EEG), which is a safe and widely used recording technique.

Your participation would require attending five therapy sessions over 2 weeks, each lasting up to two hours.
